# Tour of Holland Bloorview Kids Rehab

On February 25<sup>th</sup> Dean Don McLean, Judi Cooper from the Development Office, and Lee Bartel were hosted on a tour of Holland Bloorview Kids Rehab by Tom Chau, Director of the Bloorview Research Institute. The purpose was to get an overview of what music and sound related research has been underway at Holland Bloorview with the intention to project what research connections between music and rehabilitation exist. Research scientists, graduate students, music therapists demonstrated musical steps, Biomusic, Brain response to music by functional Near Infrared (fNIR) scan, the virtual music instrument, and music therapy. One of the interesting spaces was Screenplay, a project funded by CIHR to create a calming and engaging space for children waiting for appointments. It consists of touch sensitive squares on the floor that trigger a visual image projected on the wall and sound in the room.


